

Items to Bring to Camp (Mark your belongings)

Luggage - You will be limited to one medium-sized suitcase due to limited amount of bus space - PLAN CAREFULLY!

Sleeping Supplies - Sleeping bag (if you don't have one or can't borrow one, bring extra long fitted sheet, blankets and a pillow). It gets cold in the mountains (35-40 at night degrees is not unusual). A sleeping bag is necessary to participate in the overnight camp out. Blankets are available.

Clothes

- Pre-washed 100% T-shirt for spirit activity.
- Old jeans and shorts. Shorts for during the day and jeans are a must for the evening. (please do not bring designer jeans, as we will not be held responsible for clothing)
- Sweaters and/or jacket (a necessity on cold nights)
- 1 pair heavy shoes; 1 pair sneakers and/or boots (you need one change of shoes in case of rain)
- Swim trunks/bathing suit (SWIM TEST IS MANDATORY)
- Socks, underwear, pajamas (in case of rain, pack enough socks for daily change)
- Set of OLD clothes for arts and crafts and other special activities
- Rain Gear
- Prewashed 100% cotton item for Tie Dyeing (if you have selected tie dyeing for an Elective Activity)

Lunch - Lunches will be collected at the fair grounds and will be returned once campers reach camp. Insulated bag with campers name is recommended.

Personal Items - Towels, washcloths, toothbrush, Shampoo, toothpaste, soap, brush or comb. Supply large zip lock bag so all of these items, except for towel, can be placed inside for easy daily location.

Theme Days - Will be advertised at orientation.

Miscellaneous needs - PLEASE PUT NAME ON ALL ITEMS! ALL ITEMS MUST BE PACKED IN A SUITCASE!

- Flashlight
- Laundry bag for soiled clothes
- Insect repellent
- Camera (if you wish) - inexpensive
- Sun block lotion must accompany camper
- If you wear glasses or earrings, please bring old ones as they could get lost or broken
- Fun skits, songs, acts for Talent Night - come prepared, instruments are permitted, will be stored in a safe secure location
- Drink bottle with straw (refillable water bottle)

DO NOT BRING - money as it is not needed; good clothes or valuables as we will not be responsible for loss; snacks (attracts mice in the cabins). Because of the wildlife in the area we are encouraging "NO!!!! SNACKS!!!!!"

NOT PERMITTED - firecrackers; matches; knives; curling irons; radios; cell phones; PDA's; walkman; MP3 players; tape recorders; baby bottles; shaving cream, etc. If you have second thoughts about it, **DON'T!!! PACK IT!** Radios should only be brought by Teen Leader and must be housed in the designated location when not in use.

(Do not bring the above items and risk their being taken away or you being sent home. We want everyone to have a good time, but we do not want the safety of anyone jeopardized.)

PLEASE! Encourage your camper to bring home all their belongings. If you cannot find all their belongings but someone else's when they get home, please contact and or visit the Cooperative Extension office. Any articles not claimed within two weeks will be donated to a charity. If you should need anything, please go to the Directors cabin. Extra supplies are usually available.
