Must be enrolled in a Clothing project.

1. \*Classes 1, 2, and 12 are for Junior 4-H members only. Other classes are for all age divisions: Junior 8-10, Intermediate 11-13, and Senior 14-18. (Age as of January 1, 2010)
2. Securely **attach pattern guide** and entry tag with safety pins. If no pattern was used or 4-H'er made one's own pattern, make a note on exhibit tag.
3. Clothing exhibits must be entered on a suitable sturdy **metal hanger**.
4. A special award will be presented for 60% wool entry. Specify percentage of wool "on exhibit tag". (Senior wool item must be a complete outfit. A complete outfit would be a suit, dress, etc.)
5. All entries must be the work of the 4-H member and completed between August 2009 and August 2010. Entries from prior years will not be accepted.
6. Classes 55 and 56 must have a before photo attached to entry tag and a set of plans.

### CLASSES:

- \*1. Scarf-triangle or halter, machine-sewn (Juniors only)
- \*2. Sewing box (Juniors only) - equipped with at least needles, pins, thimble, thread seam gauge and tape measure. Must be sturdy.
3. Apron
4. Simple blouse or top woven fabric without collar or set-in sleeves
5. Blouse or shirt with sleeves and/or collar; without details (tucks, lace, other trim)
6. Blouse or shirt with sleeves and/or collar; with details (tucks, lace, or other trim)
7. Doll Clothes
8. Vest or Poncho
9. Skirt elastic waistline
10. Skirt with zipper
- \*11. Simple Quickie Non-wearable item
12. Project Runway Challenge
13. Nightgown or nightshirt - one piece
14. Pajamas - two piece

16. Pants, shorts or split skirt - elastic waist
17. Pants, shorts or split skirt - waistband other than zipper
18. Pants, shorts or split skirt - with zipper

20. Simple knit fabric garment, t-shirt, etc.

24. Clothing accessory - accessory for an animal

26. Jacket, unlined
27. Jacket, lined
28. Play wear - shorts or pants with top; swimsuit - beach cover-up
29. Sleeveless dress or jumper

31. Dress - one piece, sleeves and/or collar, no details
32. Dress - one piece, sleeves and/or collar, details (tucks, lace, or other trim)
33. Two-piece outfit, any fabric except wool (must be major pieces such as skirt and blouse, skirt and jacket, or pants and vest)
34. Evening wear
35. Clothing for young child
36. Outerwear - vest, jacket or coat
37. Simple shift or jumper (wool or wool blend)
38. Dress (lined, wool or wool blend)
39. Two piece outfit (wool or wool blend)
40. Slacks or split skirt (lined, wool or wool blend)
41. Skirt (lined, wool or wool blend)
42. Skirt (unlined, non wool blend)
43. Jacket or vest (lined, wool or wool blend)
44. Coat (lined, wool or wool blend)
45. Costume - identify activity to which garment was created and worn (attach photo if available)
46. Wearable Art - garment decorated with needlework, quilting, or sewn applique
47. Crocheting (large item sweater, vest, etc)

55. Stitching samples - 4-H'er's are to start a sample book to be added to each year. Sample requirements: 1st year - 6 or more, 2nd year - 12 or more, 3rd year - 18 or more, 4th year - 24 or more, and 5th year complete sets.

All samples must be mounted on notebook paper and fastened in a looseleaf notebook. Label each as to what it is and what fabric to use it with.

Choose from: Hand stitching samples of Basting, Running, Slip, Blind, and Whip Stitch. Hems: Clean, Finished, Lace, Bias Tape, Tailor's Hem, Catch Stitch, Knit Hem, Fused, Rolled, Lettuce Leaf, Hong Kong, and Machine.

Seams Finished: Clean Finished, Zig Zag, Pinked, Stitched and Pinked, Unfinished, Bound, Flat-felled, French, Mock French, Overcast (by hand), Top stitched, Welt, and Double-stitched. Buttonholes: Bound and Machine.

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
