1. Exhibitors do not have to be enrolled in the small pets or animal wildlife project.
2. All pre-registration forms must be returned with class entries for the Fair by July 1st, to the Extension Office.
3. 4-Hers age 5-19 years may enter each class only once. There will be participant judging of live exhibits. A written one page story of pet must accompany each exhibit.
4. The exhibitor will be responsible for feeding, watering, cleaning and care of the live exhibit while at the Fair.
5. Any small pet or wildlife animal projects not exhibited as "live exhibit" can be exhibited as a poster (14"x22") or booklet (Division F). Posters and booklets are to be entered Wednesday or Thursday, August 4th or 5th, and will be displayed all week and released on Sunday, August 15th. Judging will be Friday, August 6th.
6. No poisonous or dangerous animals, reptiles, etc. are to be on live exhibit.
7. All small pets must be housed in a cage.
8. Cage doors and openings should be tightly secured to keep pets housed.
9. Pets are to remain in cages at all times. Pets are the responsibility of exhibitor while in the building. Exhibitors must remain with pets at all times.
10. Only those animals listed below will be judged.
11. Appropriate Health Papers must accompany exhibit only where law apply's to ownership.
12. Educational displays do not have to register ownership for classes, but must display project growth for at least 3 months.
13. Educational displays will illustrate a picture of the exhibit. Themes can include care of animal, conservation of species, knowledge gained from project, etc. No live animals for this section.
14. Posters must have a hanging device and entry tag attached. (Not taped)
