1. Must be enrolled in Vegetable Garden Project and all exhibits must be grown by 4-H'er.
2. Follow guidelines in 4-H Bulletin, "Suggested 4-H Garden Exhibits". 9" sturdy plates are provided upon entry.
3. Herbs and green leavy vegetables should be displayed in clean, clear glass containers.
4. All specimens in collections will be examined and should be market quality.
